## ABOUT THE SPEAKER:

Kym Worthy, the “toughest woman in Detroit”, is the current prosecutor of Wayne County Michigan. Prosecutor Worthy has been committed to resolving a massive backlog of unprocessed sexual assault kits in Detroit since 2009. She raised awareness of the issue after discovering more than 11,000 sexual assault kits in a Detroit Police Department overflow storage facility.
